A state-of-the-art commercial building targeting industry leading sustainability standards creating spaces for people which are healthy, accessible and welcoming.

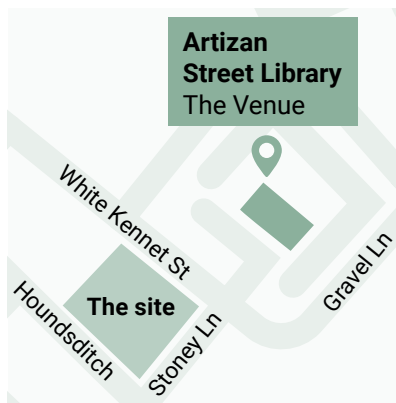
