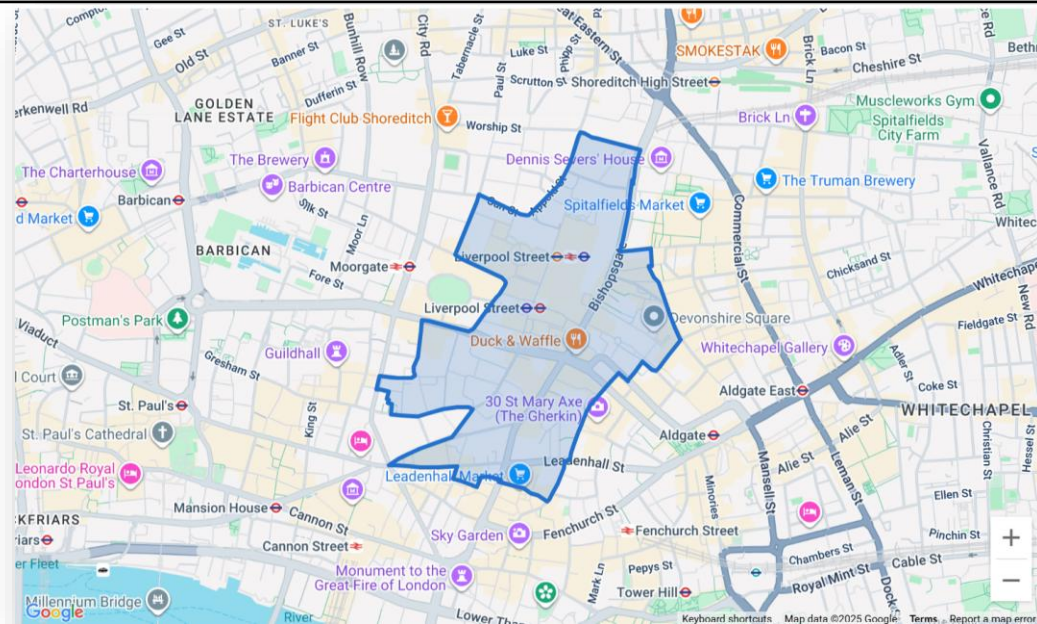

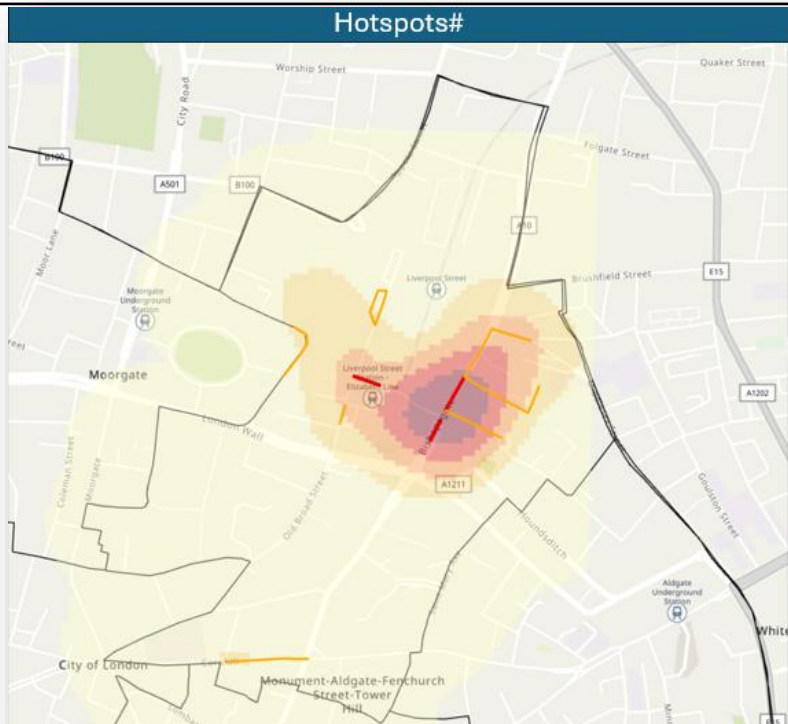
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HOT SPOT MAPPING AND HIGH-LEVEL CRIME DATA:

1st September 2025 – 28th February 2026

This is a snapshot and will be discussed in more detail at the meeting

12 Street segments (out of 1,025) within the Liverpool Street cluster accounted for 50% of crime occurrences



Crime Statistics:

- **734** crime occurrences recorded accounting for 7.6 % of total incidents across the City of London
- **All Other Theft Offences** was the most prevalent offence, with **194** offences, representing **26.4%** of all crime in the cluster.
- Peak day: Thursday
- Peak time: 17: 00- 18:00

Emerging Trends:

- As seasonal conditions improve theft-related offences may rise



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
