LIVERPOOL STREET STATION RE-DEVELOPMENT UPDATE



Following the City of London Corporation's Resolution to Grant planning consent on 10th February 2026, the application now pending approval with the Mayor of London.

The Resolution to Grant marks an important milestone in Liverpool Street Station's future, confirming the principle of the proposals shared, whilst the applicant and City planners progress the planning conditions and legal agreements required.

There is a firm commitment from Network Rail to keep neighbours apprised of developments and to maintain the collaborative dialogue which has helped us reach this stage.

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UPDATE FOLLOWING OUR ANNUAL BISHOPSGATE WAREMOTE

Within the City of London Corporation, it is a legal requirement that a Wardmote is held annually in each of the City's 25 wards.

Wardmotes are local meetings that are held annually in March and provide registered electors an opportunity to meet and question their Alderman and Councillors in the Ward.

Each year, your Bishopsgate Ward Team takes the opportunity to present an update on the work they are doing through a wide range of Committees, Boards and charities, seeking to deliver improvements to benefit Bishopsgate, the wider City and the UK's standing internationally as a global financial centre.

This year's Wardmote took place at the [Bishopsgate Institute](#) and benefited from presentations from two external speakers who deliver services which support our strategic vision for Bishopsgate. This year we welcomed Henry Johnstone, the COO of the [Eastern City Business Improvement District](#) (BID) and Wendy Hyde, the President of the [Bishopsgate Ward Club](#).

Henry outlined some of the work the BID have been involved in over the past year including community safety initiatives, activating empty properties, making improvements to the public realm, and hosting a range of events which bring the local community together. All this work is funded by a levy charged on occupiers of properties with a rateable value over £500,000. Currently 230 businesses participate, generating £3.5m a year to re-invest in the local area.

Wendy gave an overview on the City's Ward Clubs and the role they have in offering social events and companionship to those who do or have previously worked in and around Bishopsgate. From formal civic dinners to informal day trips, the Ward Club is a great way to get involved.

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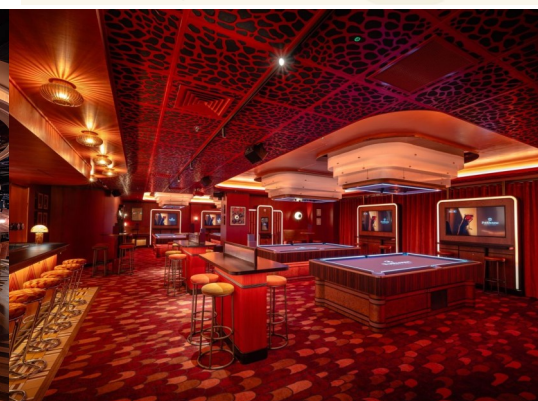
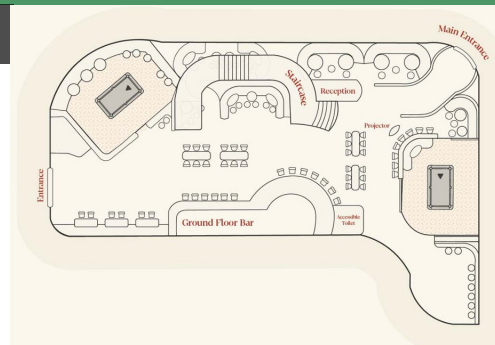
WELCOME TO POOLHOUSE AT 100 LIVERPOOL STREET

SALESFORCE RE-COMMITS TO 110 BISHOPSGATE

Salesforce extended its lease at 110 Bishopsgate (Salesforce Tower) through to 2036, reinforcing its long-term commitment to Bishopsgate, the beating heart of London's financial district.

This decision reaffirms London's role as a strategic global hub for Salesforce and while many tech companies are shrinking footprints, Salesforce is making a clear statement — the right locations still matter to their clients and employees.



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ACTION TAKEN TO ADDRESS ANTI-SOCIAL CYCLING

At the City of London Police's recent Liverpool Street Cluster Panel meeting, local residents and businesses agreed to keep anti-social cycling as a local policing priority, given the risk they pose to the public.

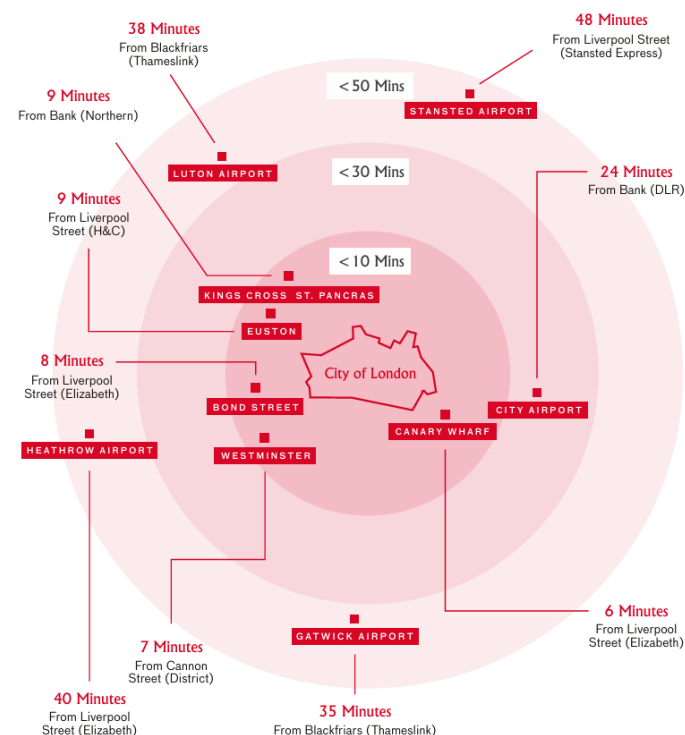
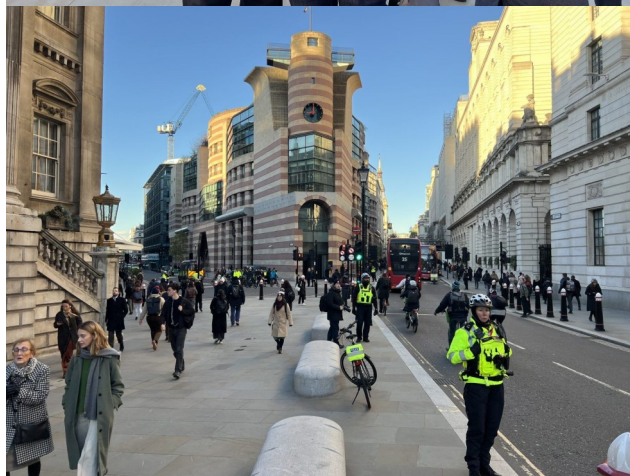
Whilst most cyclists act entirely sensibly, some do not. Bishopsgate Councillor and City of London Police Authority Board Member Ben Murphy has been working with police colleagues and London's Walking and Cycling Commissioner, Will Norman, to address the issue.

As a result, in the past year more than 1,300 cyclists have been fined in the in the Square Mile for running red lights. Enforcement has more than doubled as part of efforts to improve safety for pedestrians and other road users.

Between April 2025 and March 2026, officers issued 1,315 fixed penalty notices to cyclists for running red lights—more than double the 643 issued during the previous financial year. This averages to about 25 fines per week.

Sergeant Stuart Ford, cycle team lead at City of London Police, said: *"Most cyclists are safe and obey the Highway Code, however, we are educating, engaging, and where necessary enforcing those road users who go through red lights, putting themselves and pedestrians at risk."*

"Running a red light puts pedestrians, especially vulnerable ones, at risk. Cyclists gamble on the fact that pedestrians will move out the way, ignoring any hidden vulnerabilities. Cyclists who run a red light for the sake of saving a few minutes could endanger other vulnerable road users. We are going the extra mile by listening to concerns of the public and cracking down on anti-social behaviour and road offences."



Average train and tube travel time from the City of London:

Did you know 99.6% of office space in the City is within a 5-minute walk of a rail or tube station, enabling talent to be drawn from across the country?

The City offers six mainline stations, 12 Underground and DLR stops, two Elizabeth Line stations, frequent buses, and direct links to City Airport and Heathrow.

- ⇒ Heathrow: 40 minutes from Liverpool Street (Elizabeth)
- ⇒ City Airport: 21 minutes from Bank (DLR)
- ⇒ Westminster: 7 minutes from Cannon Street (District)
- ⇒ Bond Street: 8 minutes from Liverpool Street (Elizabeth)
- ⇒ Euston: 8 minutes from Liverpool Street (H&C)
- ⇒ Canary Wharf: 6 minutes from Liverpool Street (Elizabeth)

The number of cycle journeys in the Square Mile increased by 57% in the past two years – with bikes outnumbering cars by two to one during the day – supported by over 1,500 on-street cycle parking stands available.



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ONE APPOLD STREET GETS A REVAMP

One Appold Street is currently undergoing a £273m revamp, which will see the former 1980s office block rebuilt into a low-carbon workplace, designed by architects Piercy & Company.

Sustainability is at the heart of this scheme, with 75% of the existing structure (including substructure, frame and upper floors) retained to slash embodied carbon being released into the environment.

Six new office floors will be added to the existing steel frame, taking the building up to 14 storeys in total. The internal space will reach 558,000 sq ft.

New amenities will include a large gym, a 25m swimming pool, a brasserie and landscaped balconies on 11 of the 12 office floors.

Herbert Smith Freehills Krame have signed a 21-year lease agreement just a few hundred metres from their current London office, taking 268,000 sq ft of office space at 1 Appold Street.

The deal means the building is already a minimum of 60% pre-let ahead of its expected 2029 delivery and 100% pre-let if the option space is taken.

Bishopsgate Councillor and the City of London Corporation's Chair of the Planning and Transportation Committee, Tom Sleight explained:

"This is another big investment by British Land and GIC, and a clear vote of confidence for the Bishopsgate Ward and the City of London. It's great to see a global law firm choosing this site as their headquarters."

"The Square Mile is globally renowned for upholding the rule of law, acting as the foundation for its status as a premier financial hub and legal centre of excellence. The City is also proud of its legal heritage, including housing the Central Criminal Court (Old Bailey) and acting as a custodian of the 1297 Magna Carta".



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MARKING 30 YEARS OF CITY BRIDGE FOUNDATION

City Bridge Foundation has marked 30 years as a charitable funder, reaffirming its commitment to social justice, partnership and investing in London's future.

Bishopsgate Councillor and Deputy Chairman of the Foundation's Board, Simon Duckworth explained: *"Established almost 900 years ago to maintain London's bridges, the charity has evolved over the past three decades to support communities across the capital."*

"City Bridge Foundation remains responsible for maintaining five Thames crossings – Tower, London, Southwark, Millennium and Blackfriars bridges. Since 1995, surplus funds from the charity's £1.5 billion endowment have also been used to support civil society across Greater London."

"Over the past 30 years, City Bridge Foundation has awarded more than £895 million to over 9,000 organisations, making more than 1,200 grants to tackle inequality and injustice across London. This includes £200 million of additional funding during the Covid-19 pandemic, supporting communities through unprecedented pressures."

Mayor of Greater London, Sir Sadiq Khan spoke at the anniversary dinner, explaining: *"For the last 30 years, the City Bridge Foundation has made an enormously positive difference to life in our city and communities. The Foundation has touched the lives of countless Londoners through investing hundreds of millions of pounds across independent and grassroots charities. I'm proud to stand alongside them to tackle inequality and disadvantage, and by working together we can help the communities that need support the most."*

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ON-STREET PARKING CHANGES: SHARE YOUR VIEWS

The City of London Corporation is reviewing its on-street parking rules and we want to hear from you. To better manage our limited kerbside space, we are considering changes to our Controlled Parking Zone, including:

- when people can park on single-yellow lines
- when payment is required for on-street parking and a maximum stay of four hours applies
- what parking charges apply for on-street parking at different times of the day and week
- Disabled parking, loading restrictions and residents' off-street parking would not be affected.

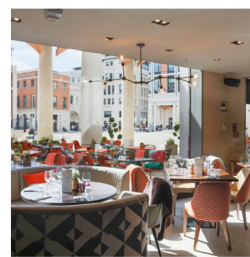

Destination City Bulletin

April 2026

The City Corporation has launched a 'Destination City Dashboard', to support our ambition of delivering growth for the Square Mile.

The strategy is trying to ensure the Square Mile remains a destination where people choose to live, work, learn, and explore. Making smarter, data-driven decisions is enabled through this Dashboard which brings together insights from multiple sources, giving us a clear view of the impact our actions are having.

Some of the data the dashboard has revealed includes:

- Employment is up 25% compared to pre-pandemic levels
- Footfall reached 127.5 million in 2025 - an 8% rise on 2024, with Saturdays now poised as a genuine growth day
- High-growth enterprise is up 11% year-on-year, with the City of London seeing double the amount of high-growth companies than the rest of the UK

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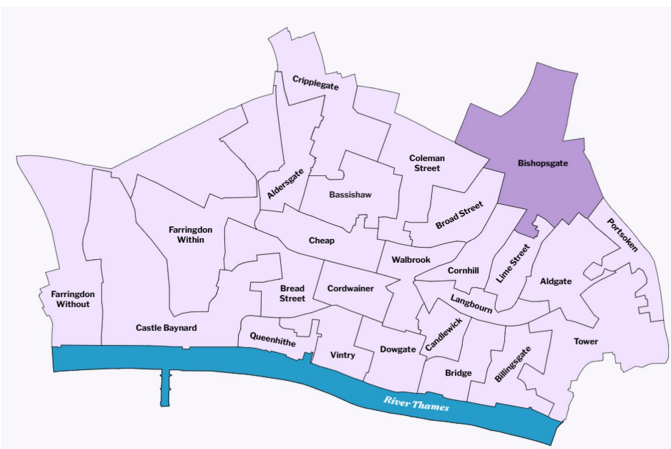
